

AD BOARD RECAP

Business/Finance Update

- Melissa provided the 2024 Cash Management Policy to the board; it was approved unanimously.
- Melissa provided the board with a copy of the SafeMinistry Policy. Tom added that this policy represents "best practices" for a place of worship, and Tom and Melissa noted that it is required by our insurance carrier. After some discussion, approval of this policy was tabled until next month, to allow additional time for the board members and CDM Director to give it a thorough read.
- Melissa also provided the board with a proposed Employee Manual, approval of which was also tabled until next month, with the same plan.

Trustee Update

- Prairie Park Project
 - Tom called a meeting of a group to discuss the actions needed to fulfill our commitment to utilize part of our land for the CRP.
- Members of the Trustee taskforce submitted a proposal to the board to form a Property Stewardship Advisory Team (PSAT) that would help oversee and manage the entire property.
 - Tom suggested that we invite Ron Turner to next month's Ad Board meeting to provide additional information on and answer questions about this proposal.
- Funding Sources for Maintenance Shed/Sidewalks
 - Larry requested that Melissa provide a summary of money available in appropriate funds for these projects. Melissa and Larry will discuss between the meetings.

AD BOARD RECAP

CDM Updates

- Brandi is looking at new flooring options for the CDM wing. Many childcare centers are moving to vinyl flooring. Tom has a contact who is going to come in and review some textured epoxy options. Brandi will provide an update to the Trustee task force.
- Brandi was identified as being "highly qualified" and an "observed strength of the center" by our state evaluator. The board congratulated Brandi on this achievement. The state review was very positive overall!

Big Ideas and Roadmap for the Year Ahead

- Karen had provided (via the Ad Board packet) the results of the Ad Board scoring the "Big Ideas" that were originally brought forth at the Ad Board retreat.
- Tom is going to meet with several people who expressed interest in being part of the Social Events Team.
- The board discussed possible considerations for adding a camera system to the building and grounds.

Organizational Work Chart

- One addendum to the original "Big Ideas" discussion was a suggestion from RJ (seconded by Will) to create a chart to identify our areas of focus and priorities, along with resources and capacity to achieve them. We need to fully understand the latter before we can start on the former.
- RJ suggested a virtual work session, with a cross-section of staff and stewardship team members, to discuss further. The board agreed with this plan. RJ will organize and communicate.




